Movement of funds approved by members present in the meeting."

[Would like to add that the funds moved from the reserve fund will be repaid from funds they are used for as soon as possible. For example, \$2500 will be used for the 70th Anniversary event – the funds need to be paid back to the reserve fund from proceeds from this event. If used for operations, then these must be paid back through funds from operations sources. Also suggest that the amount be a cap rather than a set amount.]
